    - We are hosting a Magic Show on Friday, Jan.25<sup>th</sup> in the Parish Hall from 6:30 7:30. Magician, Mikayla Oz, has been hired and is bringing "Bubbles" her professionally trained, magic bird. He can vanish, reappear and give the kids high fives. After the show they are welcome to pet the bird. We are also including popcorn, M&M's, drinks and a magic pen with the price of admission.
    - For Catholic Schools Week, we are looking into a portable coffee bar for Monday and serving teachers's donuts and muffins. We are also going to buy them all matching SAS quarter zip shirts.
